Club's swimmers awash with medals

Youngsters take county by storm

FAREHAM Nomads were awash with medals after claiming 48 at the Hampshire County Swimming Development Open Meet.

The mainly inexperienced squad of 20 swimmers achieved more than 120 personal best times at the competition at Waterlooville Leisure Centre.

They competed against 16 clubs from across Hampshire and for many of them it was the first time they had raced in 200 metre events.

Head coach John Molyneaux said: "Over the last two weekends of swimming the young and mostly inexperienced squad displayed their huge potential for the future winning a total of 48 medals and achieving in excess of 120 personal best times.

"With such a small squad it was going to be very difficult for the club to win the Top Club trophy however a fourth place finish from the 16 clubs was an excellent result."

Olivia Busher led the gold rush for the Fareham swimmers with four gold medals over a range of events. More pleasing for the coaching staff was the level of improvement with seven of her 10 swims being personal best performances. Olivia, 11, also won two silver and three bronze medals.

One of the younger swimmers also turned in some impressive performances. Georgia Kennedy, nine, won three gold and three silver medals with her best performance achieved in the 200m Freestyle, recording a time of 3.03.65.

Another fast improving younger member was Charlie Holyer, who added three gold and two silver medals to the clubs' total haul.

Having joined the club just a year ago Charlie, aged 10, impressed with some fine performances, most notably in the 100m freestyle recording 1.15.39.

Double gold and triple silver medals were added by Ryan Ireland, his best coming in the 200m Backstroke with a nine-second improvement to record 2.59.35.

His performance in the 200m Butterfly also led to further improvement but he had to settle for silver in this event.

Other gold medal performances came from Ethan Childs, Emily Blake and Emily Quick. Silver touches were added by Charlotte Beardsall, Oliver Jones, Holly Blake, Harvey Spoor, Fiona Murdoch, Tom Dickson with bronze from Oliver Busher, Emily Quick, Harvey Spoor, Harriet Burnham, Emma Skelton

Matthew Sullivan, aged 14, competed at his first open water event and won the 1,500m open water swim. He will now turn his attention to the ASA Summer National Championships which will be held at Sheffield with him competing in the 200m Backstroke. He has also qualified for the ASA National Open Water Championships.

Ollie Jones, 14, swam in the Open 5K event and was placed a creditable fourth. Evie Rowsell, 11, also competed in her first open water event racing over 1,500m.

Coach Molyneaux added: "The three Fareham Nomads swimmers did a fantastic job of representing the club at the open water event."

Now 60 club swimmers will prepare for the end-of-season Open Meet over the weekend of July 23 and 24 Waterlooville.

At the Schools Championships, Joe Davies was the only swimmer to win gold, with a time of 1.08.53 in the 100m Backstroke, a three second improvement. Clive Marquis, Matthew Sullivan and Joe Davies won silver and bronze medals.

Nomads swimmers also achieved success at Saturday's Open Water Championships in Chichester.
