Nomads squad 'swim out of their skins'

FAREHAM Nomads swimmers had a busy weekend of competition at Havant and Waterlooville Swim out of your Skins Open Meet and Rother Junior Gala.

A young squad competed in the Rother Junior Gala at Gosport against Alton, Ringwood, Andover and Gosport – with close competition between Alton and Fareham Nomads.

Head coach John Molyneux said: "In an entertaining and at times very close competition against rivals Alton, the young team from Nomads won a total of 15 events and were second in a further 18. Second place for the team was a pleasing result."

Individual winners were Evelyn Rowsell, Tom Dickson, Georgia Kennedy, Ben King, Charlie Holyer, Hannah Cooper, Ellen Jewell, Daisy Ireland and Ryan Ireland.

Fareham Nomads also sent a small squad of 20 swimmers to the Havant and Waterlooville event amassing a total of 58 personal best times and 61 medals – 21 gold, 21 silver and 19 bronze.

Fifteen-year-olds Beatrice Hollands and Christian Price were top of the Nomads swimmers, each winning five gold medals, with Christian also achieving two silver and Beatrice one. She went on to win the Senior Girls 'Skins Event' a series of 50m sprints on various strokes against seven other girls.

Anna Ross was placed third in the same event. Others to compete in this entertaining 'swim off' event were Maddie Thompson, Shona



McGrath, Daisy Ireland and in the Junior Boys event Cillian Ross.

There was double golden success for Ryan Ireland and Tom Dickson, with Daisy Ireland, Anna Ross, Maddie Thompson, Shona McGrath, Ruby Hudson, Harriet Burnham and Emily Quick achieving one apiece.

John added: "Podium finishes for Fareham Nomads squad are now becoming a regular feature at competition of this nature and with the swimming year coming to a close more is expected of the group when they compete at the Schools Championships, Hampshire County Masters Championships, the County Development Meet and the clubs' end of season open meet on July 23 and 24.

The swimmers enjoyed competing in 25m freestyle, 25m backstroke and 25m breaststroke races, plus a freestyle and medley relay, sponsored by Skoolkit, Rock Up and Little Soles.

Overall winners Crofton Anne Dale were presented with a cup by Nomads Head Coach John Molyneux, who said: "It was great to see so many schoolchildren enjoying swimming and racing against their peers. The atmosphere was brilliant, with each school showing great team spirit.

"Fareham Nomads will be running this event annually and hope to increase the number of local schools which take part.
